Some of the Ph.D. in the movement have labeled me a vulgar car salesman and that I am not fit to represent Socialism. To you, who excluded me based on my lack of education, I say, *"You are not a Socialist. Contrary to how you included me, I want to have you in the Socialist movement. We need you because we can't build a movement without the synergy of academia, the white collars, and the blue collars.

That is why DSA is failing. The inability to bring these three core groups that makeup society together. That is how Corporate Democrats and Republicans keep us separated.



I have you on my list because you are active with Our Revolution, Bernie's Campaign, DSA, Justice Democrats, North Star, a Democratic, Republican, Libertarian, or Green club, SD-USA, or Socialist Party, BernieCrat, #DemExist, #DemEnter, Working Families, etc. **In a nutshell, you are active,** and we believe the same thing.

Shared government program of the New Social and Ecological People's Union

The shared program of government presented here is the result of a collective work involving several political organizations, on the basis of programs themselves developed by involving thousands of citizens, associative, trade union, environmental and political actors.

Introduction by Jean-Luc Mélenchon

A new day is possible again. One in which the will to harmony between human beings and with nature will rule. One in which priority is given to the ecological and social ruptures that our era imposes when climate change is taking hold and wealth inequalities are spreading such that twenty people own as much as three billion of their fellow human beings. The one that puts an end to the maltreatment of liberal policies and makes the grip of the extreme right recede. If France wants it, with the legislative elections, it can bring about this new day.

For this, our organizations have formed a New Popular Union which assumes its ecological and social vocation. They propose together common candidacies in each constituency around a shared program. A majority is then possible to implement it. Therefore, those who gave us their ballot in the presidential election can confirm their confidence by voting for our common candidates. Many more will want to join us in this vote. They can thus obtain a majority of deputies in the National Assembly and form a government of which I will be the Prime Minister.

French women and men, if you want to, by voting you will satisfy many essential demands. For example, the freezing of prices, the increase of the minimum wage, the general negotiation in each branch to increase wages, the billion to fight against violence against women will be enacted and the reform for retirement at sixty years engaged. The banning of glyphosate, factory farms and the crushing of live animals will be enacted. Ecological planning, the response to the water crisis and the fight against "junk food" will be engaged. The 6th Republic and the citizen's initiative referendum will be put on the agenda.

On June 12 and 19, if you decide, by electing the deputies of the New Popular Ecological and Social Union, on that day the spring of the people will blossom, echoing that of nature.

A shared program of government

The shared program of government presented here is the result of a collective work involving several political organizations, on the basis of programs themselves developed by involving thousands of citizens, associative, trade union, environmental and political actors.

It will be the shared roadmap of the government of the New People's Green and Social Union. Our parliamentary majority will be composed of several political groups in the National Assembly, united in an intergroup. It will serve as a place for discussion and permanent coordination between its different components. This majority will jointly support the government's action, in particular by voting for the budgets and legislative projects presented that emanate from the proposals of this shared program.

But in our conception of the Republic, the role of deputies, representatives of the people, cannot be limited to supporting the action of a government. We do not want to reproduce the mechanisms of the presidential monarchy and its godillot majorities. This solitary and vertical logic of power has been pushed to the extreme by Emmanuel Macron. We must get out of it. We defend a democratic practice of institutions where Parliament is the place par excellence where decisions are elaborated, deliberated and taken. We hope that the intergroup can be the place where legislative proposals are developed, even beyond those provided for in this shared program, as well as a place for debate, exchange and decision.

We will make a great place in the legislative work of the Assembly, to the parliamentary initiative. The parliamentary majority of the New People's Ecological and Social Union will maintain strong links with active society throughout its mandate, particularly with the world of trade unions, associations, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), groups in struggle, intellectuals, etc. Its intergroup will meet regularly with the Parliament of the New Ecological and Social People's Union to feed the parliamentary debate with the aspirations and reflections of these active forces.

We apply this general method to ourselves. This framework will make it possible to combine the diversity of expressions and the coherence of decisions. **We have refused to accept the convenience of contentless syntheses to mask disagreements when we have not been able to overcome them in the short time available to us.** Indeed, on some points of the shared government program - 33 out of 650 - political organizations that support this program will bring proposals to the parliamentary debate to clarify or qualify them. **Their freedom to vote will be respected. We did not want to hide anything on this subject and that is why, however limited they may be, these points are recorded at the end of each chapter of the shared government program.** They will therefore be submitted to the debate of

the Intergroup and to the wisdom of the Assembly.

Chapter 1: Social Progress, Jobs and Pensions

Reducing working hours and creating a society of chosen time

- Convene a national conference on the reduction of working hours and the taking into account of arduousness, which will address in particular:
 - the re-establishment of the effective working week at 35 hours, by increasing overtime hours
 - the transition to 32 hours for strenuous or night jobs immediately, and their generalization through collective bargaining
 - reduction of the annual working time (sixth week of paid vacations, etc.)
- Questioning the authorizations to work on Sundays
- Put an end to flexibilization, forced annualization, intensification and split shifts

Launching major ecological projects that create jobs

- Create at least one million jobs through investment in ecological and social change
- Initiate a global plan to renovate our infrastructures to adapt them to climate change
- Accelerate the modernization and adaptation of high voltage lines to reduce environmental impact
- Launch a plan to clean up the Mediterranean and our maritime façades and seabed in the Atlantic Ocean, the North Sea, the Indian Ocean and the Pacific Ocean
- Renovate all water and sewerage systems to limit leaks
- Launching major renovation work on the railroads and reopening the lines and stations closed in the last thirty years
- Investing in energy efficiency and sobriety, as well as in innovative energy projects such as marine renewable energy
- Carry out a national diagnosis of the engineering structures (bridges, viaducts, dykes, dams) and consolidate them
- Develop an eco-construction sector using bio-sourced materials (including wood, earth and straw)

Ensuring stable employment for everyone

- Reaffirm the open-ended contract as the normal and general form of employment
- Introduce a maximum quota of precarious contracts in companies: 10% for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), 5% for large companies
- Repeal the Pénicaud ordinances and the El Khomri law and re-establish the "principle of favour": a company agreement must be more favourable than an agreement of

branch, itself more favorable than the law

- Apply the presumption of salaried status to workers on digital platforms (Uber, Deliveroo...) and all employees falsely considered as self-employed
- Offer tenure to contractual employees in the public service
- Supervise subcontracting by guaranteeing by law the responsibility and commitments of principals with regard to their subcontractors ("social responsibility" clauses, site contracts, etc.)

Increase wages and reduce wage inequality in the company

- Immediately raise the monthly minimum wage to 1,500 euros net and support VSEs/SMEs
- Organize a general social conference on salaries as well as in each branch, which will address in particular:
 - wage increases, particularly for jobs in which women are the majority of the workforce, in the care, bonding and contact sectors
 - wage gaps: limit the gap of 1 to 20 between the lowest and highest wages in a company
 - the distribution of value: set a minimum threshold for wage increases, so that the amount spent on wage increases is at least equal to the growth in shareholder returns (dividends and share buybacks)
 - professional equality between women and men (salaries, training, career, promotions...): increase of financial and penal sanctions (fines, refusal to award public contracts), creation of employee control commissions in companies
 - training, career paths and working conditions
- Revalue the salaries of civil servants and unfreeze the index point
- Prohibit golden parachutes and top-hat pensions
- Eliminate stock options

Restore protective unemployment insurance

- Reject the Macron reform and compensate the unemployed according to their last wages thanks to an insurance calculated from the first day of work
- Extend occupational medicine to the unemployed, with mandatory visits beyond six months
- Compensate the unemployed from the first day of the end of their contract
- Remove the obligation to accept a so-called "reasonable job offer"
- Stop deregistration of the unemployed at the first absence from an appointment and put an end to the logic of deregistration at the slightest pretext to artificially lower unemployment figures
- Re-establish a specific employment and unemployment insurance scheme for casual workers and temporary workers to provide them with better unemployment coverage between two periods of employment and to smooth out the

income intermittency

Making professional social security

- Ensure the continuity of personal rights (to training, to leave, etc.) outside the employment contract and transfer them from one contract to another
- Impose regular negotiations on employment, training and skills management on companies, involving trade unions
- Guarantee income maintenance in the event of retraining or education
- To give each employee the right to 36 hours of training per year, freely usable in the field of his choice
- Integrate periods of internship and apprenticeship into professional social security (seniority, leave, training)

Establish the job guarantee

- Create a job guarantee: any long-term unemployed person will be offered a useful job in an emergency sector, paid at least the minimum wage, financed by the State and consistent with his or her qualifications, career path and wishes, or follow a training course leading to a qualification, paid for at 100%.
- Create job guarantee committees composed of representatives of the long-term unemployed, trade unions, uberized workers, economic and integration actors and local authorities

Putting an end to suffering at work

- Recognizing burn-out as an occupational disease
- Doubling the number of labor inspectors
- Strengthen occupational medicine, integrating it into the public health service, restoring the compulsory medical check-up upon hiring and periodic check-ups throughout the career, including during periods of unemployment, to guarantee better monitoring of workers
- Revise the table of occupational diseases to take into account all risks related to the environment or technology
- Restore the Health, Safety and Working Conditions Committees (CHSCT), increase their resources and make their opinions binding
- Reinstate and consolidate the personal account for the prevention of arduous work (C3P) with rights associated with workstations and a dedicated contribution
- Include all carcinogens identified by the International Agency for Research on Cancer as occupational diseases, including pesticides
- Make the number of work-related accidents a selection criterion for access to public contracts
- Make the right to disconnect effective and provide a framework for teleworking

Recognize citizenship in the company and new rights for employees

- Increase employee representation in the decision-making bodies of large companies to at least one third, and half in large companies, and include other stakeholders, such as environmental or consumer associations
- Establish new rights of intervention and decision-making for employees in companies on working conditions, management and strategic orientations
- Organize the election of Social Security administrators by the insured themselves
- Create a right of pre-emption to allow employees to take over their company in the form of a cooperative
- Giving more power to employees during business recovery and liquidation procedures and introducing the right to a vote of no confidence in company directors or strategic projects
- Give works councils a suspensive veto over redundancy plans and new rights of control over the finances of their companies

Guaranteeing a dignified retirement

- Restore the right to full retirement at age 60 for all after 40 years of contributions, with special attention to long and discontinuous careers and difficult jobs
- Maintain the balance of pensions by subjecting dividends, profit-sharing, employee savings, share buybacks and overtime to employer contributions, by increasing the old-age contribution rate by 0.25 points per year and by creating a surcharge on high salaries
- Reinstate the factors of arduousness removed by Emmanuel Macron
- To raise all pensions for a full career to at least the level of the revalued SMIC, and the minimum old age pension to the level of the poverty line
- Taking into account the active solidarity income (RSA) to validate quarters for retirement
- Indexing pensions to wages
- Prohibit the Pension Reserve Fund from investing in polluting sectors

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

The Socialist Party and Europe Ecologie-Les Verts will not support the right of suspensive veto of works councils on redundancy plans and will propose that the job guarantee be based on the mobilization of existing mechanisms, in particular "Territoire zéro chômeur de longue durée" (zero long-term unemployed), within local committees for employment in solidarity for a guaranteed and sustainable employment policy

The Socialist Party will not support the abolition of all stock options and the proposed tenure of all contractual employees in the public service.

The French Communist Party will propose to finance the job guarantee by a redeployment of public aid to companies and new social contributions and to integrate the years of study in the calculation of the annuities for retirement.

Chapter 2: Ecology, Biodiversity, Climate, Commons and Energy

Apply the green rule through citizen ecological planning

- To inscribe in the Constitution the green rule, which imposes not to take more from nature than it can reconstitute, in particular by recognizing a legal status for nature (possibility of defending it in justice, taking it into account in decisions...)
- Engage in democratic ecological planning to implement the green rule, starting from the local level and relying on the participation of citizens, unions, associations, communities and professional sectors
- Organize planning on the basis of new indicators of human progress in order to put the economy at the service of needs and criteria of good living (health, education, etc.). Evaluate the impact of each law with these indicators (income inequality, poverty reduction in living conditions, carbon footprint, healthy life expectancy, etc.).
- Create a Council for Ecological Planning that supervises, organizes and implements the plan, also involving banks and companies. This plan is built with citizens, unions, associations, communities and professional branches, relying on permanent bodies to evaluate local needs in terms of jobs, training and investments
- Provide the State and its public operators (such as Cerema, the National Forestry Commission, the French Biodiversity Office and Météo France) with the human and financial resources to carry out their planning role
- Raise France's climate ambitions with a target of a 65% reduction in emissions by 2030 (instead of the current 40%) and publish an annual assessment
- Require medium and large companies to implement carbon accounting for direct and indirect emissions certified by an approved public body, starting with the sectors that emit the most greenhouse gases (GHGs) - energy, transport, construction, heavy industry - and then, depending on the size of the company, accompanied by a trajectory for reducing their emissions
- Create an Agency for Relocation under the Council for Ecological Planning, in charge of identifying socially and environmentally indispensable industrial sectors and establishing a relocation plan adapted to each identified strategic sector or production

Make the overseas territories the front line of ecological planning and short circuits

- Establish a customs shield *via* a mileage tax in favor of local production with a low ecological footprint, apply a trade preference for overseas products to France and Europe and establish balanced trade partnerships with regional neighbors
- Move towards food self-sufficiency through ecological peasant agriculture and local agri-food chains

- Protecting exceptional biodiversity: fighting against land artificialisation and illegal fishing, strengthening human and financial resources for the protection of biodiversity, etc.
- Promote energy self-sufficiency plans

Enabling equality of populations through public services

- Guarantee access to all essential public services (school, train station, hospital, post office, etc.) and to sports and cultural facilities within fifteen to thirty minutes (by car or public transport) of any residential area
- Plan the installation of local businesses with the municipalities, in particular by financially supporting the installation of essential businesses and craftsmen
- Supporting the local associative fabric by maintaining subsidies, by generalizing multi-year agreements and by moving away from the logic of calls for projects
- Organize general assemblies for working-class neighborhoods and general assemblies for rural areas to build real territorial equality, particularly in public services

Reorganizing the State and local authorities in the service of ecological planning

- Involve municipalities and communities fully in the decisions and implementation of ecological planning investments, allow their free association
- Strengthen the resources of local authorities by increasing their allocations, ensuring their sustainability and dynamism over time, and guaranteeing full compensation for skills already transferred
- Reforming allocations and local taxation to make them fairer, in particular by increasing resources for communities where social and environmental inequalities are concentrated (working-class neighborhoods, rural areas, overseas territories, etc.)
- Organize a conference on the organization of local authorities and decentralization to make a proposal to simplify and clarify the role of each level

Investing for the ecological and social bifurcation of our economy

- Launch a massive plan of 200 billion euros over five years to invest, develop employment and training, and re-establish democratically managed public poles in energy, transport and health, in order to reindustrialize the country through sector plans in the service of ecological bifurcation
- Cancel the tax gifts granted without compensation to the largest companies over the last ten years

Develop ecological public transport, rethink individual mobility

- To create a public transport and mobility pole, around a reunified and 100% public SNCF, in order to ensure equal service and access throughout the country, and to refuse to open up rail lines to competition
- Reopen the daily rail lines, increase the number of trains, maintain physical ticket offices in the stations
- Initiate a national plan to provide massive support for the development of public transport (metro, bus, streetcar, tram-train, cable, etc.) in large urban areas
- Guarantee accessible fares and targeted free travel measures (young people, people on low incomes, etc.) and lower the VAT on public transport fares to 5.5
- Develop on-demand public transport outside of dense public transport areas
- Eliminate air routes when the train alternative is less than three hours
- Encourage the use of bicycles: development of secure bicycle infrastructure and bicycle parking, make public bicycle parking near stations and public services and private garages mandatory in all constructions and renovations
- Develop car-sharing: support community initiatives in favor of car-pooling and car-sharing
- Strengthen support for the purchase of new or used electric vehicles, particularly for low-income households
- Make the sustainable mobility package paid to employees - particularly for cycling - compulsory, with the possibility of combining it with train passes, and simplify and adapt its payment procedures to teleworking
- Install low-emission vehicle fleet systems for low-income households throughout the country
- Adopt an ambitious plan for the development of rail freight, piggybacking and modal transfer (maritime, river and airship cabotage)
- Renationalize highways by reversing past price increases
- Initiate a specific plan for the development of public transport in the French Overseas Territories, which are almost non-existent today, based on the model of the tram-train project in Reunion Island
- Create a one-way ticket system open to young people allowing access to all trains, public transport as well as bicycles and self-service cars in France

Planning the bifurcation and energy retrofit

- Plan the transition to 100% renewable energies and the exit from nuclear power with a double watchword: sobriety and efficiency. Abandon the EPR (European Pressurized Reactor) projects, plan the dismantling, rehabilitation and reconversion of nuclear sites and their entire catchment areas.
- Getting out of carbon-based energy: stop subsidizing fossil fuels, including abroad
- Guarantee the first quantities of energy essential to a dignified life and introduce progressive pricing that penalizes misuse and waste
- Refuse the liberalization of the electricity and gas market: stop the

privatization of hydroelectric dams, preserve the national character of the electricity distribution network

- Create a public energy pole including renationalized EDF and Engie as well as local cooperatives
- Promote throughout the territory the use of various energy sources best suited to the weather and geographical conditions (in particular to combat excessive methanization)
- Re-insulating at least 700,000 homes per year and putting an end to energy poverty: giving priority to complete renovations, effectively banning the rental of thermal flats, strengthening programs to detect energy flats, targeting renovation aid according to household income, with a zero balance of payments for the most modest and a cash advance system
- Provide the means: train and recruit professionals, set up a public "one-stop shop" for owners who need to renovate
- Establish a single collective agreement for nuclear workers and stop the massive use of subcontracting, while guaranteeing their retraining

Consume differently, a "zero waste" France

- Prohibit programmed obsolescence and extend the legal warranty periods for products
- Fight against the overproduction of waste: immediately ban single-use plastics, reintroduce and generalize deposits, develop channels for the reuse of materials and substitution for carbon-based materials
- Create a public service for repair and reuse, based on social and solidarity economy structures, with the establishment of training for the trades concerned (electrical, electronic, construction, textile sectors, etc.) to develop the circular economy
- Lowering the VAT on repair services
- Make eco-design of products mandatory in order to limit the use of non-renewable resources
- Generalize as soon as possible the durability index of products (possibility of being repaired, life span, etc.), make the availability of spare parts mandatory and prevent the marketing of those with an insufficient durability score
- Reduce advertising in public spaces and on television, prohibit the advertising of products and services that emit the most greenhouse gases on all advertising media, prohibit the deposit of commercial advertising leaflets in mailboxes, digital advertising panels and commercial telephone canvassing

Establishing food sovereignty through ecological and peasant agriculture

- Create 300,000 agricultural jobs to establish a relocalized, diversified and ecological agriculture

- Guarantee remunerative prices for producers by setting minimum prices for farmers, prohibit sales at a loss and set up a hive-off fund to take over the agricultural debts of those who convert to 100% organic farming
- Overhaul the CAP (Common Agricultural Policy): start moving away from the current system of area-based subsidies and redirect them towards labor-intensive and ecologically sustainable farms, taking into account natural handicaps and services rendered to the environment
- Immediately revise the National Strategic Plan (budgetary programming document of the CAP) to distribute aid more fairly and direct it towards ecological and peasant agriculture, with the objective of reaching 30% of the useful agricultural surface in organic agriculture in 2030 and 100% in 2050
- To carry out an agrarian reform to control and regulate agricultural land and production more effectively, to pass a law of orientation and agricultural programming, in particular to facilitate the recovery of available land, to encourage the installation of new farmers and the development of human-sized farms
- Fight against the artificialization of soils to prevent the disappearance of useful agricultural areas
- Plan the gradual withdrawal of synthetic fertilizers and pesticides, and immediately ban the most dangerous (glyphosate, neonicotinoids), with financial support if necessary
- Establish ecological and social protections according to the conditions of production and remuneration of agricultural work
- To frame the agricultural prices by maximum prices established by a multiplier coefficient starting from the production costs and to limit the margins of the large-scale distribution, to make it possible each one to be nourished, while ensuring worthy incomes for the farmers
- Develop short circuits to reduce the circulation of goods and the use of packaging

Putting an end to junk food

- Create a Ministry of Food Production
- Urgently ban the most controversial additives, limit the list of authorized additives to those allowed in organic agriculture
- Set maximum levels of salt, sugar and saturated fatty acids in processed foods and guarantee the application of the law, including in the Overseas Territories, and make the nutri-score (nutritional labeling) mandatory to put an end to misinformation from large-scale distribution
- Prohibit food advertising on all media (radio, audiovisual and electronic) aimed at children and adolescents
- Integrate nutrition education into school curricula, from kindergarten to college, using hands-on workshops
- Experiment with a universal guarantee of access to selected foods as a first step towards a "social security of food", in order to allow everyone to have access to food, particularly seasonal and organic fruits and vegetables, in local public or association stores
- Guarantee permanent access to five seasonal fruits and vegetables at blocked prices and reduce VAT on organic products

- Gradually increase the food in collective catering to 100% local and organic, reduce the share of meat proteins and offer a daily vegetarian option
- To develop territorial food projects (TAP) elaborated in a collective way with farmers, inhabitants, producers and their organizations to adapt food production to local needs and to create the necessary tools (producers' stores, processing workshops, central kitchen...)

Socializing the fundamental commons

- Guarantee public management of a list of common goods and essential services established by referendum
- Create a Commons Advocate to produce and publish an annual report
- Prevent private property rights from prevailing over the protection of water, air, food, life, health and energy

Prevent and fight against pollution and hazards

- Helping the victims of pollution and whistleblowers on the basis of a fund financed by the polluting productions
- Give back to the State and local authorities the human and financial means to apply the triptych "monitor, control, sanction" and regulate in the face of the free market
- Reverse the weakening of environmental standards and public participation mechanisms decided during the previous five-year term (e.g., decrees allowing prefects to waive environmental standards)
- Establish an emergency plan for the rapid depollution of permanently polluted regions in France, including as a priority Guadeloupe and Martinique, victims of chlordecone, and take charge of the screening and treatment of chlordecone-related diseases
- Manage industrial risks with the creation of an independent safety authority for industrial risks, increase the number of inspectors of Installations Classified for the Protection of the Environment (ICPE), increase the threshold of the maximum fine for ICPE to 500,000 euros (against 15,000 euros currently), systematically prosecute cases of non-compliance with standards
- Strengthen the resources devoted to crisis and environmental risk management to anticipate the effects of climate change
- Train all citizens in the framework of mandatory annual civil security exercises, in the areas of health, nuclear, flooding or forest fires
- To initiate the exit from activities that are hazardous to health and the environment (such as ammonium nitrate fertilizers) and to allow the reconversion of workers to useful sectors of activity

Making water a central issue for humanity

- Create a high commissioner for water

- Organize 100% public management of water within the framework of a decentralized public service, based on local public utilities open to citizens
- Establish a "blue rule" that applies the principle of the "green rule" to water (do not take more from nature than it can replenish) for its use and for the protection of its quality
- To inscribe access to water, its sanitation and the right to hygiene as a fundamental human right
- Crack down on illegal water shut-offs with deterrent penalties
- To make the right to water and sanitation effective by providing free cubic meters essential to a dignified life and by abolishing the subscription fee
- Introduce progressive and differentiated pricing according to usage to fight against misuse and waste
- Provide free public water fountains, showers and toilets in the area
- Reinforce the staff of the water police present on all territories to control more strictly the capture by the bottled water industries, and prevent any industrial or agricultural pollution
- To reach during the mandate the very good ecological and chemical status of all the watercourses (rivers, streams) and groundwater reserves
- Systematize the use of river freight as soon as possible

Guaranteeing the right to water in the Overseas Territories

- Guarantee access to clean running water to all inhabitants of the Overseas Territories, whatever the cost
- State financing of urgent pipe replacement work, particularly in Guadeloupe, on drinking water supply and sanitation
- Adopt public management of water and sanitation and provide for substantial sanctions when delegates, concessionaires and farmers do not fulfill their contractual obligations, particularly with regard to network maintenance
- In the event of a shortage, activate a plan for the distribution of bottled water (ORSEC-water plan) and cap the price of bottled water in all areas where the public drinking water and sanitation services are failing
- Cancel the citizen debt resulting from the billing problem of the former operators and/or resulting from unpaid bills for services not rendered and stop the forced collection of the debt
- Ensure that neither existing debt nor future investments by water operators will increase water users' bills

Defending the forest, lung of the planet

- Increase the human and financial resources of the National Forestry Office and stop its privatization to enable it to carry out its missions, including welcoming the public
- Improve working conditions for foresters by strictly applying the principle of equal pay for equal work, increasing foresters' wages and preserving the right to early retirement
- Prohibit clear-cutting except in cases of proven sanitary impasse
- Encourage the creation of small producers' cooperatives and groupings

the management of private forest plots

- Increase the share of public forests, notably through the creation of a public right of pre-emption, the requisition of abandoned plots of land and the classification of state forests in the public domain
- Rebuild the entire wood processing sector with the objective of diversifying species and developing short circuits, by setting up public professional training and re-establishing local sawmills
- Supervise the use of wood in energy production and promote its sustainable use in construction
- Ensure full traceability of imports in order to ban those linked to deforestation from public procurement and force companies to exclude these products from their supplies
- Increase international cooperation to fight against illegal practices that destroy forests (timber trafficking, gold mining and mining)
- Promote species and age diversification for climate change resilient forests
- Strengthen human and material resources for fighting forest fires

Breaking with animal abuse

- Banning factory farms
- Limiting the transport time of live animals
- Prohibit cruel practices: battery hens and rabbits, crushing of chicks, tail docking, etc.
- Ban all fur farms, immediately for mink farms
- Determine new standards to improve breeding conditions: access to the open air, grazing, density, minimum surface area, and gradually organize the exit from cage farming before the end of the five-year period, with the necessary financial support
- Directing research towards alternative and ethical methods that will eliminate animal testing
- Prohibit hunting and "recreational" practices that are cruel to animals (e.g., hunting with hounds, bullfighting, cockfighting, shows involving wild animals, etc.)
- Establish no-hunting days on weekends, holidays and during school vacations

Saving the ecosystem and biodiversity

- Stop urban sprawl: renounce large, useless and ecologically harmful infrastructure projects and giant warehouse projects, bring living areas and employment areas closer together, plan urban and economic development according to the imperative of maintaining biodiversity and combating artificialization
- Prohibit the patenting of living organisms to prevent the appropriation of animal and plant species by private companies
- On a global scale, reject genetically modified organisms (GMOs), put an end to international trade agreements whose consequences affect the climate and biodiversity and contribute to imported deforestation

- In France, protect habitats and species in a concrete way: ban pesticides, starting with a ban on them around inhabited areas, manage water sustainably (depollution and public authorities)

Protecting the seas and oceans

- Work towards the creation of an international law of marine biodiversity, especially in the deep sea
- Making France the world leader in maritime research and education
- Create a sea school in each maritime department, develop professional training in ecological and sustainable fishing techniques
- Sustainable management of the resource *through* artisanal fishing and the fight against illegal or destructive fishing practices
- Defend a moratorium on drilling in the Mediterranean and on deep sea mining as requested by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN)
- Controlling the removal of marine sand for the construction industry and combating illegal extraction on a national and international scale
- To obtain international recognition of the French maritime space in order to ensure its preservation and increase the means of surveillance of our maritime domain

- Classify 30% of the French maritime territory as a protected maritime area, including 10% under strong protection, to make them true sanctuaries

Living up to France's maritime responsibilities

- Develop renewable marine energies within the framework of public control of installations and networks. Nationalize Alstom's marine energy branch, sold to General Electric, and Areva's offshore wind energy branch, sold to Siemens
- Guarantee the sustainability of the French merchant marine through industrial development and social, fiscal and ecological anti-dumping measures and modernize it, in particular to develop less polluting propulsion. Strengthen research in the field of commercial sailing
- Modernizing port infrastructures in a multimodal sea-rail-river logic
- Initiate the construction of strategic vessels under public control (renewable maritime energies, surveillance of the maritime domain, submarine cables, etc.)
- Increase the resources of the Paul-Émile Victor Polar Institute, initiate a plan to renovate and modernize research stations in Antarctica, and acquire an icebreaker to support oceanographic research

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

Concerning the energy transition, the French Communist Party will propose a trajectory that combines renewable energies with nuclear energy and will not associate itself with the 100% renewable objective and the abandonment of the EPR projects. The

The Socialist Party will propose to optimize the lifespan of nuclear power plants, to plan the work allowing to extend their operation, and to do so under the control of the Nuclear Safety Authority (ASN) and the Parliament. The Socialist Party and Europe Écologie-Les Verts will support the creation of a public energy pole including EDF, Enedis, RTE, GRT-Gaz and GRDF, but will not support the renationalization of Engie.

Europe Écologie-Les Verts will propose that the public transport and mobility pole favours the emergence of cooperative actors on lines abandoned by the public authorities in order to reinforce the network of railroad lines throughout the territory.

Europe Écologie-Les Verts will propose the granting of a legal personality to animals and the recognition of their fundamental rights.

The Socialist Party and the French Communist Party will not support the proposals on hunting and bullfighting.

The Socialist Party will propose that the objective in 2050 be to convert 100% of the agricultural land to agro-ecological practices, not just organic.

Furthermore, the Socialist Party will not support the framing of agricultural prices by maximum prices, the nationalization of the marine energy branch of Alstom, the offshore wind power branch of Areva and Alcatel Submarine Network.

Chapter 3: Wealth Sharing and Tax Justice

Establish social and ecological protections to produce locally and ensure our independence

- Relocate the productions essential to the life of our country
- Make aid to companies conditional on compliance with environmental and social criteria and the fight against discrimination within the company. Enable employee representative bodies to monitor compliance with these criteria. Requiring the reimbursement of aid in the event of non-compliance with the counterparts
- Adopt emergency anti-dumping measures on strategic industries
- Launch an industrial reconstruction plan to put an end to France's dependence in strategic fields (semiconductors, medicines, etc.) and to meet the social, environmental and economic independence challenges (battery recycling, steel needed for renewable energies, aluminum, etc.)
- Revise the Public Procurement Code to favor social and solidarity-based, ecological and local enterprises
- To make an inventory and evaluation of the agreements already applied and to impose the respect of social and ecological standards for the marketing of products imported into France
- Requiring a prior guarantee deposit with the Bank of France in return for a foreign investment in the country
- Review the tax advantages on French savings invested abroad, and the

- delete outside the European Union, especially for life insurance
- Establish business location criteria for national and local public procurement and for the granting of aid to companies
- Support alternative projects led by employees in the face of closure or relocation projects, in particular through the public banking pole
- Renegotiate the World Trade Organization (WTO) framework and place it under the aegis of the UN
- Expand the duty of care of multinationals at the European level and ensure access to redress for those whose rights have been affected by the activities of companies and their supply chains

Reverse privatizations and defend our industrial tool

- Renationalize strategic airports, highways and the Française des Jeux by organizing the participation of users in decisions and the right of intervention of employees
- Expand the State's right to requisition factories and enterprises of general interest in cases of social, health or ecological necessity
- Declare a moratorium on public-private partnerships (PPP), audit those in progress
- Create a special commission to take stock of the tax favors, privatizations and abandonment of flagships such as Alstom, Alcatel, EADS, for three decades
- Pursue the attacks on the French industrial heritage as part of the "fundamental interests of the Nation", as provided for in the Penal Code
- Prohibit stock market layoffs
- Prohibit economic layoffs by companies that pay dividends or receive public aid
- Postpone repayment of government guaranteed loans (GGPLs) by two years.

Create a public banking pole

- To form a public banking pole thanks to the socialization of certain generalist banks, which will redirect the credit towards the ecological and social bifurcation of France and will finance the very small, small and medium-sized companies on social and environmental criteria (subsidized rates)
- Enable the Public Investment Bank to finance itself at zero interest with the ECB and to be eligible for refinancing operations at negative rates
- Clean up the financial flows that are currently largely directed towards investments in fossil fuels (taxation, malus, bans, etc.)

Bringing finance to heel and defining the real economy

- Introduce a meaningful tax on financial transactions
- Separate investment and deposit banks
- Identify and ban toxic and useless financial derivatives, limit leverage and exorbitant shareholder returns
- Limiting LBOs (buyouts of a company by a company that resorts to

- the loan) only to procedures for employee takeovers of companies
- Granting employees a right of intervention on dividend distribution policy
- Put an end to the continuous listing of companies on the stock market
- Modulate shareholders' voting rights according to the length of their involvement in the company

Refuse to be blackmailed about the public debt

- Get the European Central Bank (ECB) to transform the share of government debt it owns into perpetual debt at zero interest
- Have the ECB buy back the public debt circulating on the financial markets
- Conduct a citizen audit of the public debt to determine the illegitimate portion
- Remove the Covid debt from the Social Security accounts (Caisse d'amortissement de la dette sociale)
- Set up a hive-off fund to take over the asphyxiating private debts of VSEs/SMEs contracted during the pandemic

Making the tax revolution

- Make the income tax and the generalized social contribution (CSG) truly progressive with a 14-bracket scale
- Reinstate and strengthen the solidarity tax on wealth (ISF), including a climate component to tax large polluters calculated according to the carbon footprint of assets held
- Reorganize the corporate tax system to establish tax equality between SMEs and large groups, introduce a progressive scale according to the profits made and their use, and encourage investment rather than the distribution of dividends
- Creation of an inter-company equalization fund to mutualize the social contribution between small and large companies
- Abolish the flat tax and tax capital income at least as much as labor income
- Increase the inheritance tax on the highest assets by taking into account all gifts and inheritances received throughout one's life and create a maximum inheritance of 12 million euros (i.e. 100 times the median net worth) and by eliminating tax niches that allow the wealthiest to escape inheritance tax
- Reduce VAT on basic necessities, reintroduce a "luxury VAT"
- Evaluate each of the tax niches and eliminate those that are unfair, socially inefficient or ecologically harmful; for the remaining niches, transform "tax reductions" into "tax credits" so that everyone can benefit equally from these financial incentives, regardless of their income
- Introduce a universal tax on companies (basing their taxation on the activity actually carried out in France) and on the income of individuals in countries with privileged taxation to fight against tax evasion
- Reinstate the exit tax abolished by Emmanuel Macron

- Tax the companies that have profited from the health crisis and the consequences of the Ukrainian crisis and direct the revenues towards the necessary investments and the ecological and social bifurcation
- Reorganize the property tax to make it progressive and to ensure that everyone pays according to his or her real total wealth
- Put an end to the conjugal quotient, a patriarchal system that favors wage inequalities between women and men, and replace the current unfair family tax quotient by a tax credit per child that all families could receive
- Make the fight against tax fraud and evasion a priority: release the necessary human and financial resources and take initiatives in conjunction with all countries that have decided to take up this fight
- End the judicial public interest agreement that allows companies to negotiate their financial penalty for tax fraud
- Increase prosecutions and toughen penalties for white-collar offenders convicted of tax evasion, and strengthen the tax administration

To generalize the social, solidarity and cooperative economy

- Ensure SSE access to financing and public procurement
- Promote the development of cooperative societies of collective interest (SCIC) and cooperative and participative societies (SCOP) in order to develop common services whose responsibility is shared between citizens and users, employees, public and private partners
- Give back power and means to citizen associations and popular education actors, and put an end to the practice of funding by call for projects
- Develop cooperatives of activities and employment (CAE) in order to fight against the status of self-entrepreneur and develop forms of joint work

Eradicate poverty

- Establish a dignity guarantee that leaves no individual below the poverty line (1063 euros per month for a single person)
- Immediately freeze the prices of basic necessities (gasoline, food, energy) and permanently control the prices of basic foodstuffs
- Achieve the goal of zero homelessness: double the number of shelter spaces (currently estimated at 100,000) and simplify the system
- Automate the payment of social assistance and benefits in order to fight against non-use
- Restructure the loans of over-indebted households, guarantee effective access to basic banking services for all and cap bank fees
- Ensuring free access to sanitary protection

Building the autonomy of young people

- Create an autonomy allowance for young people set above the poverty line (1063 euros for a single person)
- Introduce a five-year "youth employment" proposal in the

non-market and public sector

- Increase internship allowances and negotiate with employer branches the positions open to internships, to put an end to the practice of disguised fixed-term contracts
- Organize, during the first year of the mandate, a debate on the introduction of a citizen conscription for women and men under 25 years of age, paid at the minimum wage for tasks of general interest. This citizen conscription could include a health check-up, an evaluation of writing, reading and arithmetic skills, with an upgrade if necessary, as well as free training in driving and the passing of the driving license for each young person. This debate will result in a bill submitted to the National Assembly

Guaranteeing the right to housing

- Prohibit rental evictions without a proposal for public rehousing
- Implement a universal rent guarantee creating a safety net against unpaid rent for tenants and landlords alike
- Regulate rents everywhere on the territory and lower them in large cities, adopt a housing shield that limits the share of income spent on housing
- Build 200,000 public housing units per year for five years to the highest environmental standards
- Raise the minimum threshold of social housing per municipality (SRU law) to 30%, increase sanctions against municipalities that do not comply with the law and order prefects to systematically take over from defaulting mayors
- Impose a progressive tax on high speculative real estate transactions to finance the fight against substandard housing
- Make it mandatory to renovate "thermal apartments" before renting them out
- Fight against substandard and unhealthy housing: make a "rental permit" mandatory throughout France (prior authorization issued by the public authorities), launch a major housing renovation plan, use the right of pre-emption and guarantee decent and rapid rehousing for poorly housed people
- Restore public aid for low-income housing, avoid rent increases on re-renting and guarantee rehousing at constant rent in the context of rehabilitation or reconstruction
- Use the right of requisition and surcharges to fight against vacant dwellings, and to put them back in rent
- Impose in new constructions that 100% of the housing be accessible, as provided for in the 2005 law on disability
- Fight against speculation on housing by limiting short-term rentals (AirBnB type) to owner-occupiers and for a limited period
- Launch an emergency bed bug prevention and eradication plan, with the creation of dedicated local public services
- To revise the Flood Risk Prevention Plans in line with the new threats and to create a Fund to help relocate buildings threatened by floods and rising seas
- Revalue the personal housing subsidies (APL) in line with inflation, reverse the reforms of the Macron quinquennium and in particular the 5

and strengthen the means dedicated to support to fight against non-use

Putting digital technology at the service of the general interest

- Guarantee the right to a minimum free access to the Internet and the digital coverage of the whole country in very high speed at affordable cost by 2025
- Constitutionalize the right to data and communication encryption
- Systematize the publication of public information held by local authorities in open data (open democracy)
- Guarantee the maintenance of counters, personnel, and paper forms despite the dematerialization of public services and the digital transformation of administrations, deploy a local public service to support the 20% of French people who have difficulty with digital technology (illiteracy)

Guaranteeing digital sovereignty

- Guarantee net neutrality, i.e. equal access and equal treatment for everyone
- Bringing digital and telecommunications infrastructures under public control
- Create a public agency for open source software in charge of planning its strategic development area by area by identifying the gaps and funding the key projects
- Generalize the use of open source software in public administrations and national education
- Allow all citizens and companies to access online services and software hosted on French servers under French law
- Repeal the law "Fight against the manipulation of information"
- Guarantee the hosting of data of French public services and essential companies on servers under French law located in France
- Advocate for global Internet governance by establishing a dedicated agency at the UN
- Strengthen French excellence in the virtual world, support French creations
- Create a national video game center and develop a public training program in this field
- Create a national mission to master artificial intelligence
- Create a French foundry for microprocessors
- Nationalize Alcatel Submarine Networks
- Reduce the ecological impact of digital technology (regulations on programmed obsolescence, incentive policies on low-code, carbon index on the Web, indication of the environmental footprint based on life cycle analysis...)
- Reduce the heat production and electricity consumption of data centers and make them subject to a construction permit
- Relaunch the GAFAM tax project aimed at increasing the contribution of large groups to the financing of online content creation

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

Europe Ecologie-Les Verts and the Socialist Party will support the constitution of a public banking pole but do not wish to nationalize generalist banks, and will propose that the proposals relating to data hosting be applied at the European rather than the French level.

The Socialist Party will propose to implement a public policy of prevention of evictions through the reinforcement of housing subsidies for tenants, the compensation of landlords for the time to find alternatives to eviction, the reinforcement of administrative and legal support and the replenishment and simplification of the housing solidarity fund and the compensation fund for landlords.

Europe Écologie-Les Verts is not in favor of a universal tax based on nationality but wishes to make the taxation of French income progressive for French people abroad in order to fight against the tax discrimination from which some of them suffer and against tax evasion.

The French Communist Party will propose to replace the CSG with social contributions rather than making it progressive, as well as maintaining the principle of the family tax quotient and will not support the creation of youth jobs for a limited period.

Europe Écologie-Les Verts considers that the fight against dumping and for the respect of social and ecological standards are battles that must be fought as a priority at the European level.

Chapter 4: Public services: health, education, culture, sport

Putting health first and rebuilding public health facilities, including hospitals

- Rebuilding the public hospital service
- Establish "100% Social Security" by reimbursing 100% of prescribed health care and integrating complementary health care into Social Security
- Reopen public emergency rooms, maternity wards and EHPADs to ensure a local public health service within thirty minutes of each French citizen
- Get out of the T2A (activity-based pricing) and the policy of figures which puts hospitals in a situation of conflict of interest with the Social Security
- Initiate a multi-year recruitment and pre-recruitment plan for care and medical-social professionals (doctors, nurses, care assistants and administrative staff), upgrade professions and incomes and increase the capacity of public health establishments, particularly hospitals
- Acting on all the levers to combat medical deserts: creating multidisciplinary public health centers and hiring salaried doctors, increasing the resources of medical faculties to allow for a better understanding of the medical situation, and improving the quality of care.

real abolition of the numerus clausus, mobilization of liberal and hospital medicine, medical cooperatives, selective contracting, temporary obligation to install, etc.

- Develop environmental health: make the National Environmental Health Plan (PNSE) a means of eradicating chronic diseases linked to air pollution, junk food and exposure to pollution in a professional setting (pesticides, radioactivity, asbestos, chemicals)
- Ending the HIV epidemic in France by 2030 through a major national testing and treatment plan
- Make mental health a major cause of the five-year term: increase the resources of medical-psychological centers (CMP) and structures dedicated to mental disabilities, and increase the number of places in medical schools in the psychiatric field
- Protecting health research from finance

Organizing for pandemics

- Adopt a pandemic prevention and adaptation plan that respects fundamental freedoms, based on the rolling society, sovereignty, health planning and outreach policies that promote access to immunization
- Repeal the laws on the state of health emergency and the health pass and replace it with a new health crisis management system discussed in Parliament
- Provide for the lifting of patents on medicines and equipment necessary for an urgent health response, and make it compulsory to share knowledge, skills and technologies with a view to the massive and equitably distributed production of essential medical goods
- Temporarily requisition companies that are essential for the production of sanitary materials (masks, tests, purifiers) and emergency supplies
- To ensure our health sovereignty by developing the production of medicines and medical equipment
- To create a public pharmaceutical cluster which will have to :
 - Ensure the relocation of the production of medicines and vaccines necessary for health sovereignty
 - Guaranteeing the supply of a strategic reserve
 - Ensure price control on all health products and communicate their real costs
 - Enable transparency in research and development funding
 - Implement conditionality of aid received by private companies for research into vaccines and medicines
 - Produce and massively disseminate vaccines and treatments that have been licensed on a voluntary basis

Putting an end to the abandonment of the Overseas Territories

- To initiate a multi-year investment and development plan for public services (transport, education, health, housing, culture), the possibility of which has been outlined in the proposals of social movements, particularly in Guyana and Mayotte

- To ensure territorial continuity (public service at regulated rates) and intra-territorial opening up (in Guyana in particular, without destroying the primary forest) and extra-territorial opening up
- Guarantee school attendance and free public health care for all
- To support the teaching of overseas languages and cultures, and to integrate the teaching of overseas history into national school curricula, in mainland France and overseas
- Put in place a price framework for essential products to fight against the high cost of living
- Putting an end to discrimination against the local population in civil service recruitment
- Develop action plans with local assemblies to combat youth unemployment, including promoting the relocation of the economy
- Offer training sessions (history, geography, culture and local issues) for civil servants not originating from overseas
- Initiate a specific plan for child protection in the Overseas Territories: provide each community with appropriate child protection and maternal and child welfare structures, recruit staff and train them in local issues

Develop a public service for the arts and culture

- Increase the budget dedicated to art, culture and creation to 1% of GDP per year
- Restore an ambitious public service of culture for the cultural actors and the public
- Resume major cultural work to put an end to territorial inequalities in terms of structures for creation, teaching, dissemination and artistic and cultural memory
- Extend free admission to all museums and public monuments, and lower the prices of public and private services (cinema, concert halls, etc.)
- Create a free online public media library with works in the public domain and a proposal of recent works temporarily programmed on the basis of Gallica
- Support the creation and appropriation by all of cultural works and practices, by revalorizing artistic education in schools, conservatories, popular education and the place of culture in works councils
- Reverse the excessive tax privileges associated with cultural sponsorship
- Improve the system of intermittent workers in the entertainment industry on the basis of the common base of demands of the 2021 theater occupations movement and extend it to other discontinuous cultural and event-based professions, such as "extras" in the hotel-restaurant industry and tour guides
- Create a National Center for Artists and Authors that will organize professional elections in order to design a social protection system adapted to these professions
- Harmonize the status of artistic teaching staff and reorganize the artistic research sector through higher education
- Launch a training and recruitment plan for local cultural jobs, particularly for young people

Investing in research and science

- Increase public research funding to 1.5% of GDP by 2027
- To fund general plans for research themes in future areas
- Increase the level of public investment in research
- Building a protective status for young researchers
- Develop universities that are more open to society, with dedicated services responsible for organizing the link between researchers and the population, in a spirit of dissemination of knowledge and citizen reflection on its use
- Organize the dialogue between science and society: citizen debates, broadcasting of scientific programs on public channels
- Create a public service of scientific publication with open licenses to allow citizens and universities to access researchers' articles for free without enriching private journals and databases
- Strengthen the major public research institutes (CNRS, Inserm, INRA, etc.), which are the guarantors of research of general interest, and abolish the National Research Agency
- Participate in the emergence of French-language open access scientific journals
- Replace the High Council for the Evaluation of Research and Higher Education with an evaluation of training and research units carried out in consultation with the various research stakeholders within the framework of the National Council for Higher Education and Research (CNESER) and the National Council of Universities (CNU)
- Promote an international ethical charter for the use of technosciences
- Ensure the autonomy of basic research and the sustainability of research funding by putting an end to systematic calls for proposals

Freeing sports and bodies from money

- To act for the creation of a sports association in all primary schools to make free and accessible the practice of a physical activity supervised by teachers and educators
- Move towards four hours of PE in the school curriculum
- Increase taxation on sports broadcasting on television to contribute to the financing of amateur sport
- Democratize the management of sports federations and ensure the sovereignty of members over their federation, by encouraging more cooperative modes of organization (SCIC type)
- Reimburse health sports, or "sports on prescription", thanks to Social Security
- Generalize adapted physical activity in medical and social establishments
- To make effective the right to learn to swim in school for all
- Promote women's sports, establish parity in the televising of major sporting events and make them accessible on public channels
- Strengthen the accessibility of sports facilities for people with disabilities and the visibility of disabled sports events

- Recognize the specificity of deaf and hard of hearing people in Olympic sports competitions
- Redeploy and strengthen the technical and sports advisors (CTS) throughout the territory
- Implement a national emergency plan for the construction and renovation of sports facilities
- Promote free sports activities for the poorest populations with the State paying 50% of the cost of licenses based on social criteria
- Organize the actual implementation, both monitored and evaluated, of an action, training and awareness plan on sexual violence, harassment and LGBT-phobia in sport
- Reactivate the National Support Forum

Eradicate illiteracy and develop literacy

- Eradicate illiteracy for school leavers and adults by 2027
- Develop literacy structures and French language courses for non-French speakers
- Initiate a plan to fight illiteracy in prisons
- Financing of associative support programs
- Identify people suffering from illiteracy through national and annual actions, and offer them a free refresher course

Making the public service of the early childhood

- Create a public service for early childhood and open 500,000 places in crèches and adapted childcare facilities over five years, ensuring territorial equality and the possibility for each family to have access to childcare facilities
- Plan the creation of nurseries (public and public companies) and kindergartens with a reduced number of children, guaranteeing access to an outdoor space with real vegetation
- Increase human and material resources to improve working conditions in existing structures
- Move towards free public crèches, starting with the generalization of progressive pricing

Rebuilding a global school for equality and emancipation

- To ensure that public education is truly free, including transportation and extracurricular activities, to provide students with free textbooks, as well as unbranded supplies, in order to ensure real equality of conditions among students and to fight against commercial intrusion into the school
- Move towards free school canteens in conjunction with local authorities
- Ensuring equality in schools:
 - Reduce class sizes everywhere to do better than the European average, which is currently 19 students per class, with priority given to pre-primary classes, vocational high schools and schools in priority education

- Allow schooling from the age of 2 for parents who wish to do so
 - Objective "zero dropout": strengthen remedial education systems by offering appropriate group and individual support. Re-establish the RASEDs in primary education
 - Establish a new school map that includes private schools and a priority education map that meets educational needs and puts an end to school segregation, in consultation with local authorities, unions and parent associations
 - Modulate the financing of private schools under contract according to their compliance with the school map and the obligations of school diversity
 - Extend compulsory schooling to 18 years of age, offering, if necessary, a guarantee of autonomy from the age of 16
 - Guarantee the variety of modern languages taught and their learning from the first grade onwards
 - Increase the number of classes for newcomer students
- Revaluing the staff of the National Education and reinforcing the means:
 - Catch up and put an end to the freezing of the index point, revalue the salary grids by engaging in negotiations with the trade unions
 - Adopt a multi-year recruitment plan for all competitive examinations, with a pre-recruitment system for the teaching profession that favors the access of young people from all social backgrounds, create professional teaching schools
 - Strengthen school life staff everywhere and recognize their pedagogical role (educational assistants, teaching assistants)
 - Put an end to permanent evaluations and controls by affirming pedagogical freedom, redefine the relationship between the hierarchy and the personnel to put an end to top-down management which is the cause of much suffering at work
 - To create a real public service for the support of students with disabilities, with a new body of civil servants, by training and giving tenure to the current AESH (assistants for students with disabilities)
 - Implement administrative and educational support for principals and improve teaching release for all kindergarten and elementary school principals
 - Strengthen school medicine by guaranteeing the number of staff per school
 - Restore the national framework for public education:
 - Guarantee the unified nature of the national public education service in terms of teaching content, recruitment methods and staff status
 - Reinstate the national baccalaureate diploma, repeal the Blanquer counter-reforms of the high school and the vocational track
 - Repeal the Carle law, which obliges city councils to finance private schools in other municipalities
 - Prohibit extra-legal subsidies from local governments to private schools
 - Making schools the lever of ecological and democratic change:

- Integrate the ecological issue in the programs from kindergarten to high school and introduce new practical lessons (repair, construction, cooking, gardening...)
- Increase the food in school canteens to 100% organic and local, reduce the share of meat proteins in favor of vegetable proteins and impose a daily vegetarian option
- Build new establishments and renovate existing buildings to take into account health and environmental issues (particularly asbestos removal)
- Expanding the right of assembly and association for high school students
- Reinforce education on equality, against sexism and discrimination, in school programs
- Strengthen prevention against bullying and the fight against addictions
- Formulate a "global school" project: make school and extracurricular activities coherent

Qualify everyone

- Increase the number of public vocational and agricultural high schools and classes
- Create professional polytechnic centers, combining public training courses ranging from the vocational aptitude certificate (CAP) to the higher technician certificate (BTS)
- Reinstate the framework for the creation of apprentice training centers (CFAs) under the authority of the regions
- Prohibit private professional diplomas, ensure the recognition of diplomas and qualifying training in collective agreements
- Reinstate the four-year vocational baccalaureate and strengthen general education
- Protecting short courses in higher education and encouraging further study after a vocational or technological baccalaureate (BTS, DUT, professional licenses, etc.)
- Structuring the professional sectors that meet the ~~the~~ needs of the ecological and social bifurcation
- Restore and develop human and financial resources for training in public agricultural high schools
- Allow free access to boarding places for students and apprentices under the condition of resources and for those who are farthest from the places of learning
- Reinstate a national public guidance service with the participation of the regions
- Reserving the apprenticeship tax for public institutions

Refounding higher education

- Eliminate the selection at the university aggravated by Parcoursup
- Create new seats to meet needs, especially in first-year and short courses in higher education
- Make higher education free of charge, from the bachelor's degree to the doctorate
- Repeal the increase in tuition fees decided by Macron for

foreign students

- Restore the necessary means to higher education and research by basing them on permanent funding and a permanent increase in the budget of universities and research centers
- Recruit 30,000 statutory staff in higher education and research in five years and upgrade all staff, including technical and administrative staff
- Put an end to the precariousness of higher education personnel by granting tenure to those who have permanent missions and by repealing the research programming law for the years 2021 to 2030
- Replace the laws on the freedom and responsibilities of universities (LRU) and Fioraso to put an end to the competition between universities, restore the national framework of degrees, recruitment and a true university democracy
- Establish a university health service with sufficient staff to provide free access to health, prevention and psychological support
- Aligning the resources granted to different courses of study (preparatory classes, post-baccalaureate schools related to health and social training, public grandes écoles, etc.)
- Prohibit the for-profit nature of private schools of higher education
- Launch a major plan for university real estate, including the construction and renovation of laboratories, lecture halls and places for social, civic and student life
- Build 15,000 additional student housing units per year, renovate and bring existing units up to safety and environmental standards

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

The Socialist Party and Europe Ecologie-Les Verts will support 100% reimbursement of prescribed care, but will propose that this be done without integrating complementary health insurance into the social security system. The French Communist Party would like to see complementary health insurance companies focus on prevention and the management of health centers.

They will support the ratification of the European Charter for Regional and Minority Languages, the co-officialization of regional languages and the bilingual and immersive teaching of regional languages and the public service role of the associative networks fully recognized.

Europe Écologie-Les Verts defends a reform of the National Research Agency based on a logic of cooperation rather than competition between research institutes, including universities, and reinforcing the share of recurrent credits abandoned in favor of calls for projects.

The Socialist Party will not support a ban on extra-legal subsidies from local authorities to private education, particularly for extracurricular activities, nor will it support the repeal of the laws on the freedom and responsibilities of universities (LRU) and Fioraso and the principle of university autonomy.

Chapter 5: 6th Republic and democracy

Enable citizen intervention

- Establish the Citizens' Initiative Referendum (CIR)
- Democratize suffrage: give the right to vote at 16, recognize the blank vote, institute the right to vote for foreign residents in local elections
- Recognize a digital right of petition, supervised by the Commission nationale de l'informatique et des libertés (CNIL), allowing a bill to be placed on the agenda of the assemblies, and lower the admissibility thresholds
- Establish a procedure of citizen sponsorships for the presidential election as an alternative to the 500 sponsorships of elected officials
- To systematically present to the Bureau of the National Assembly the proposals made by citizens within the framework of citizens' conventions or assemblies created for this purpose
- Make it mandatory to hold a referendum on constitutional amendments
- To give Corsica the status guaranteed by article 74 of the Constitution
- Defend the commune as the basic level of democracy and citizenship
- To make effective the principle of the non-accumulation of mandates and allowances (only one executive mandate at the same time, except for the inter-municipalities, two consecutive mandates maximum)
- Reversing the sentences imposed on citizens, trade unionists, environmental activists, politicians, associations and Yellow Vests who exercised their right to demonstrate through an amnesty law
- To facilitate the entry and the exit of the mandate, to set up a statute of the elected representative with guarantees of training and employment for an assembly more representative of the people
- Impose and enforce parity in the government, parliament and local authority teams

Moving to the 6th Republic and ending the presidential monarchy

- Move to the 6th Republic which is a stable parliamentary regime, with a new constitution adopted by referendum
- To have the National Assembly elaborate the modalities for the transition to the 6th Republic (Constituent Assembly, Citizens' Convention, election, drawing of lots, citizens' forums, etc.)
- Elect the National Assembly by proportional representation and revise the electoral calendar to dissociate the legislative elections from the presidential election
- Allow Parliament to truly control the action of the executive, notably by abolishing procedures that restrict the rights of Parliament, such as blocked votes, Article 49.3 of the Constitution and voting reservations
- Strengthen parliamentary oversight powers, particularly with regard to external operations
- To propose the modification of the article 1 of the Constitution: "France is an indivisible, secular, democratic, social and ecological Republic"

Implement a plan to separate finance and government

- Combat the influence of lobbies in the parliamentary debate: prohibit their gifts to members of parliament, members of the government and their offices and make it compulsory to publish the meetings of key public decision-makers with interest representatives
- Provide for ineligibility penalties for anyone convicted of corruption
- Toughen the rules against conflicts of interest and prohibit "pantouflage": any senior civil servant wishing to work in the lucrative private sector will have to resign from the civil service and reimburse the cost of his or her training if he or she has not served at least ten years, and extend to ten years the periods of prohibition on holding a private office after having worked as a civil servant in the same sector
- Abolish the monopoly of the tax administration alone to initiate legal proceedings in all cases of fraud, whatever it may be: the judiciary must be able to investigate freely, even against the advice of the minister
- Organize professional elections for company managers whose results will determine the representativeness of each organization, as is the case for employee unions
- Engage in a comprehensive reform of the financing of political life
- Stop outsourcing public policy design and evaluation to private consulting firms
- Abolish the Macron reform of the prefectural and diplomatic corps

Guaranteeing freedom of conscience and secularism

- Defend the indivisible, secular, universal, democratic, social and ecological Republic
- To protect the freedom of conscience and expression, to fight against all communitarianism and the political use of religions
- Refusing to grant the title of canon of the Lateran to the President of the Republic
- Prohibit the presence at religious ceremonies of ministers, prefects and mayors in the exercise of their functions, except in cases where these persons wish to express the solidarity of the Republic with a religion following an event of an exceptional nature due to its scope or gravity
- To repeal the concordat of Alsace Moselle and the various specific statutes in force in the Overseas Territories and to refuse public funding for the construction of new religious buildings, dedicated to religious activities or denominational establishments
- Restore and increase the resources and autonomy of the Interministerial Mission of Vigilance and Combat against Sectarian Aberrations (Miviludes)
- Launch a vast training plan for civil servants on secularism, on the legal principles of the 1905 law, and strengthen the pedagogy of secularism in national education
- To guarantee the possibility of effective access to a secular public school for every municipality in the country

Democratize the media and pass an anti-concentration law

- Adopt an anti-concentration law in the media and initiate their democratization
- Create a National Media Council, including the current ARCOM (Regulatory Authority for Audiovisual and Digital Communication), with the participation of representatives of the sector's professionals and users, in charge of monitoring compliance with the anti-concentration law and guaranteeing pluralism and quality
- Transform the "Media Ethics Council" into a true citizen power
- Protect the sector from financial and political interests by strengthening the legal status of editorial offices, introducing a code of ethics in the collective agreement, and giving editorial offices the right to approve the entry of a new shareholder
- Promote cooperatives of journalists, media workers and readers/viewers/listeners, allocate frequencies to local media and associations
- Pooling of distribution tools (printers, servers, distribution)
- Restrict public aid to the press to news media only, making it conditional on compliance with social law and collective agreements, equal pay for women and men, and the establishment of cells for reporting sexist and sexual violence
- Exclude from public funding media that have been convicted of inciting hatred or offending the dignity of persons
- To have the presidents of France Télévisions and Radio France validated by the Parliament and to integrate in the specifications of Radio France and France Télévisions obligations to treat overseas news at standard viewing times
- Ensure protection of sources and whistleblowers, without forcing them to report to their employer first
- Maintain the fee as a dedicated, earmarked and dynamic funding, making it progressive for more fiscal justice and increasing it to reach a budget comparable to other European countries
- Ban polls in the days leading up to elections, launch a parliamentary commission of inquiry into polls (methodology, publication, financing)

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

Europe Écologie-Les Verts is in favor of direct universal suffrage and proportional election of the inter-municipalities and the departments.

France insoumise will propose to abrogate the concordat of Alsace Moselle and the various specific statutes in force in the overseas territories. The French Communist Party will propose that this exit be undertaken through a negotiated process. The Socialist Party will propose that a parliamentary information mission be conducted on this subject as part of an action plan to promote and defend secularism.

The Socialist Party will propose that the National Assembly be elected on a predominantly proportional basis and that the amnesty law apply only to those who have exercised their right to demonstrate without violence and within the law.

The French Communist Party will not support the right to vote at 16. It is not in favor of granting Corsica the status provided for in Article 74 of the Constitution.

Chapter 6: Security and Justice

Ensure better access to justice for all

- Increase the resources of the justice system, recruit and train more civil servants: judges, court clerks, agents of the judicial protection of youth and the prison administration
- Increase legal aid and ensure the return of local courts
- Put an end to the gradual disappearance of popular juries, abolish criminal courts without juries and experiment with juries in correctional courts
- Strengthen the rights of the defense, enshrine the right to a defense in the Constitution, strengthen the place of the lawyer
- Guarantee that the most common procedures (e.g. divorce) are free of charge

Developing effective justice policy

- Present regularly to Parliament, for debate and vote, a text of orientation of the penal policy
- Strengthen the independence of the judiciary, especially the prosecution, from the executive: prohibit individual feedback except when it calls for direct intervention by the executive in matters of public order (e.g., terrorism), align the status of prosecutors and their appointment rules with those of judges
- Respect the dignity and rights of persons deprived of their liberty: put an end to prison overcrowding, renovate all prison and detention facilities, develop alternative sentences, ensure that prisoners have the means to reintegrate, in particular by increasing the resources and staffing levels of the prison integration and probation services (SPIP)
- Fight against financial crime: double the number of staff in the services that fight against financial crime, really abolish the Bercy lock, give more human resources to the brigades in charge of financial crime, increase the number of investigating judges and abolish the judicial agreement of public interest
- Fight against the impunity of sexual aggressors and the correctionalization of rapes by systematically considering them as crimes
- Provide the means for effective environmental criminal justice, punish industrial pollution and strictly apply the polluter-pays principle
- Abolish the Court of Justice of the Republic
- Strengthen the resources of the National Commission for Information Technology and Civil Liberties to ensure the strict application of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)
- Giving more resources to the Human Rights Defender

Deploying a new counter-terrorism strategy

- Facilitate the prosecution of companies or associations for illegal activities or tax evasion that allow for the financing of terrorism, establish as the main penalty the disqualification of natural persons who participate in such activities, and requisition companies that collaborate with the aggressors
- Strengthen the human resources of intelligence by going back to the merger of the Direction de la Surveillance du Territoire (DST) and the Renseignements Généraux (RG) and give priority to human infiltration
- To proceed to the evaluation of the results of the laws in force, in particular the laws on internal security and the fight against terrorism, to abrogate the permanent state of emergency, the laws on separatism and global security which undermine our individual liberties
- Fighting against recruitment and supporting programs to care for suspected criminals
- Guarantee judicial review of counter-terrorism operations
- Strengthen the human resources of the PHAROS platform in charge of preventing and monitoring violence on the Internet

Reorganizing the police to guarantee the right to safety

- Re-establish the local police: reorganize the missions of the national police to ensure the link with the population, redeploy the staff of the BAC (anti-crime brigades) and BRAV-M (brigades for the repression of violent motorized actions) after a few months' training, distribute the staff in such a way as to ensure equality between the territories, in consultation with the municipalities
- Strengthen the resources of the judicial police, double the number of technical and scientific police
- Construct new police activity centers, including a community policing presence
- Extend the initial training of peacekeepers to two years and revise its content, reopen national schools for police activities
- Strengthen mandatory continuing education for police officers: diversify training courses (justice, associations, etc.), provide more training on how to deal with victims (especially of sexual and gender-based violence)
- Eliminate performance-based bonuses that encourage a policy of numbers
- Increase the number of staff in charge of financial crime, human trafficking and the dismantling of mafia networks, and double the number of technical and scientific police
- Prohibit by law all use of facial recognition technologies in public spaces and establishments, as well as their experimentation, and strictly control their use in the private domain
- Repeal the Global Security law and reinforce prevention logics, especially the human resources of specialized prevention
- Promote de-escalation in policing: ban maiming weapons, lethal restraint techniques and the
"To establish a new code of ethics for the police based on the 1986 code of ethics

- To create a commission of inquiry into police violence that has resulted in the death or mutilation of citizens in order to establish all responsibilities
- Abolish the General Inspectorate of the National Police (IGPN) and the General Inspectorate of the National Gendarmerie (IGGN), and replace them with an independent authority including magistrates, academics, citizens
- Strengthen environmental policing by creating environmental units within public prosecutors' offices and by transforming forest wardens into environmental wardens
- Improve the working conditions of police officers and gendarmes, in particular premises and equipment, psychological and administrative support, guarantee their effective right to leave, put an end to "bonuses exceptional" in lieu of salaries

Changing the strategy on addictions and drugs

- Legalize and regulate the production, sale and consumption of cannabis by means of a state monopoly, under conditions that make it possible to combat addiction
- Allocate the revenue from cannabis taxes to anti-addiction programs, particularly in schools, and to a policy of prevention, harm reduction and detoxification assistance
- Tackle the causes of addiction, to engage in a policy of risk reduction rather than continuing a policy of repression of consumers
- Increase police and customs forces for investigation and tracking purposes
- Fight against the organizers of cigarette trafficking and target youth "zero tobacco"

Protecting children

- To ensure the respect of the International Convention on the Rights of the Child concerning the protection of children, foreign children, the prohibition of so-called educational violence, support for parenthood
- Guarantee the respect of the principles of the February 1945 ordinance on children in conflict with the law and establish a children's code combining civil and criminal law in consultation with professionals
- Massive increase in financial and human resources for child protection, for equality between all children of the Republic and quality educational support
- Unlocking the means to build additional shelters that will allow children to be separated by age group, to preserve siblings, to preserve young victims of sexual assault (resilience centers), to provide emergency shelters on an ad hoc basis, to take into account a psychiatric care dimension
- Make it automatic for all children from the Aide Sociale à l'Enfance (ASE) to be covered by a young adult contract
- Genuinely fight sexual violence against children by increasing the number of police officers specializing in the fight against cyber pornography, by training professionals in contact with children and by funding appropriate care, protect and

to accompany the children's speech

- Strengthen the resources of the judicial authority dedicated to processing reports of illegal content on private platforms and to monitoring their effective removal

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

The Socialist Party rejects the use of the term "police violence" and therefore will not support the creation of a commission of inquiry into police violence that has led to the death or mutilation of citizens in order to establish all responsibilities.

The Socialist Party and the French Communist Party will propose the organization of a public debate in the first year of the legislature on the issue of legalization of cannabis.

Chapter 7: Equality and the fight against discrimination

Achieving equality between women and men

- Adopt a law to fight sexism and violence against women, and allocate the one billion budget against violence against women requested by the associations, particularly in terms of training and accommodation places
- Impose and enforce parity between women and men in the management of political, administrative, economic, trade union and associative institutions
- Strengthen family planning and equality-seeking organizations
- Fight against forced part-time work, 80% of which involves women
- Extend the duration of parental leave, and make it the same for both parents by aligning them at the top
- Reimburse menopausal hormone therapy
- Support medical research on gynecological diseases (endometriosis, PCOS, etc.) in order to improve their management and treatment
- Implement a plan to combat gender-based harassment and sexual assault
- Strengthen the network of abortion centers by opening one center per hospital and abolish the double conscience clause for doctors
- Fighting against gender stereotypes in schools
- Abolish prostitution and guarantee the dignity of the person, strengthen the means dedicated to the fight against trafficking and violence related to prostitution

Guarantee new rights

- Constitutionalize the non-commodification of the human body and the fundamental right to self-determination in all circumstances
- Add to the Constitution the right to contraception and voluntary interruption of pregnancy (IVG), the right to die with dignity (including

- with assistance) and guaranteed access to palliative care
- Authorize a free change of civil status before a civil registrar
- Establish filiation by recognition as a default principle, reimburse medically assisted procreation (MAP), make it accessible to trans people, and refuse surrogate motherhood (GPA), make the best interests of the child the first principle, in all circumstances
- Implement a plan to eradicate violence against LGBTQIA+ people

Fight against racism, anti-Semitism and discrimination

- Implement a global action plan against all forms of discrimination (employment, housing, education, health, etc.)
- To guarantee the right to full citizenship for all children born in France and to facilitate access to French nationality
- Create an Equality Commission with a Discrimination Observatory and specialized units within public services and appeal courts
- Implement the receipt for identity checks by law enforcement agencies to fight against racial profiling, accompanied by training, monitoring and sanctions
- Establish February 4 as a national holiday in memory of the victims of slavery and their struggles, in addition to the day of commemoration specific to each overseas territory
- Opening the archives on the wars of decolonization
- Repeal the law against "separatism" and the law against "asylum and immigration" and enforce the law making all persons convicted of incitement to racial hatred ineligible

Facing collectively the loss of individual autonomy

- Building a public service for dependency, to help seniors stay at home
- Develop a public network of retirement homes with harmonized and accessible rates
- Create 10,000 places per year in public EHPADs for five years, rethink the financing model, increase material and human resources
- Train, qualify and recruit the necessary personnel in sufficient numbers: at least 210,000 medico-social and medical personnel to be able to respect a minimum ratio of "bedside" staff
- Revaluing the jobs and incomes of all professionals working with the elderly, both at home and in institutions, by overhauling pay scales and qualifications

Removing barriers to the autonomy of people with disabilities

- Ensure the financial autonomy of disabled people by raising the AAH (Allocation aux adultes handicapés) to the level of the minimum wage and making it independent of the spouse's income

- Increase the number of complete bilingual French/French sign language (LSF) courses (from kindergarten to high school) to allow real access to knowledge and training for deaf and hard-of-hearing children
- To perpetuate the financing of the professional integration of people with disabilities
- Universal accessibility objective: zero tolerance against obstacles, i.e. obstacles to movement or daily life, allow prefects to substitute themselves for mayors to impose work and close private buildings that do not comply with the law, impose a plan to put in place a system to ensure the accessibility of the buildings. accessibility of transportation, generalize translations into French "easy to read and understand" (FALC), visual and sensory markers
- Fighting against validist discrimination

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

Noting the lack of real efficiency on the networks of the policies at work (penalization of the client), Europe Écologie-Les Verts wishes to act in priority, not by repression, but by listening and accompanying people in situation of prostitution. Europe Écologie-Les Verts wishes that a contradictory debate on GPA (surrogate motherhood) be opened.

Chapter 8: European Union and International

We share the common objective of putting an end to the liberal and productivist course of the European Union and of building a new project in the service of the ecological, democratic and solidarity-based bifurcation, even if our histories with the European construction differ.

France Insoumise and the French Communist Party are heirs to the left-wing no to the European Constitutional Treaty in 2005, the Socialist Party is attached to European construction and its achievements, of which it is a key player, and Europe Écologie-Les Verts is historically in favour of building a federal Europe.

Together, we want to shift European policies towards social justice, ecology, human progress and the development of public services.

To do this, we propose to:

- **Strengthen the fight for the climate:** target a 65% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions by 2030, raise European targets for renewable energy production, establish 30% of protected areas, remove gas and nuclear power from the taxonomy, pass a new environmental treaty that includes the crime of ecocide.
- **Transforming the common agricultural policy** in favor of agro-ecology and peasant and localized agriculture, the exit of synthetic fertilizers and pesticides, the transition of industrial breeding towards sustainable practices and respectful of animal welfare. A remunerative agriculture for the farmers and rich in jobs, supported by a regulation of the markets, and which gives everyone access to quality food.

- **Extend social rights:** harmonize social rights and European minimum wages upwards in order to fight against social dumping, to improve working conditions and to converge towards the best social standards, fight against relocation, defend the principle of "*equal work, equal pay and equal social contributions*" by going back on the current organization of posted work, impose a presumption of salaried status for platform workers, develop a European plan to fight against poverty, especially for children and the elderly.
- **Health:** encourage and help Member States to guarantee universal access to health services, including mental health services, in particular by combating medical deserts, relocating the production of medicines in Europe and lifting patents on vaccines and medicines.
- **An economy at the service of the climate and the citizens: to put an end to the stability and growth pact and to abrogate the budgetary rules of the 3% deficit and the 60% debt, to modify the missions and the statutes of the ECB to allow it to lend directly to the States and to place it under democratic control to make it a political tool at the service of the general interest with ecological and social objectives and no longer only on inflation.**
- **Investing together in the ecological and solidarity bifurcation:** creating new own resources (tax on extended financial transactions, mileage tax, kerosene...), strengthening European investments and dedicating at least 50% of the European budget to climate and biodiversity, ensuring that the rest of the budget does not harm them.
- **Eradicate tax evasion:** end unanimity on tax matters to remove the veto power of tax havens, introduce a minimum corporate tax rate of 25%, establish a credible European list of tax havens and impose sanctions on them, in order to end tax competition within the EU.
- **Establish social and ecological protections:** refuse all new free trade agreements, establish new cooperation agreements based on binding and controllable social, environmental and sanitary clauses, implement social and ecological taxation at the borders, integrate local production criteria into European public procurement to protect our economy and promote new social and environmental standards.
- **Welcome exiles with dignity: put an end to the Dublin III regulation and renegotiate the Asylum and Migration Pact, whose foundations are very unbalanced, promote the creation of legal and safe migration routes, create a rescue corps at sea and put an end to the violations of fundamental rights by Frontex**
- **Conquering equality:** applying the "most favored European" clause to harmonize women's rights in Europe from the top down, inscribing the right to abortion and all other sexual and reproductive rights in the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union and making it directly applicable, reinforcing the fight against all forms of discrimination, whether related to origins, sex, disability, sexual orientation or gender identity, and defending minority rights.
- **Strengthen democracy:** suspend European funding to Member States that do not respect the rule of law or fundamental freedoms, defend a European regulation on media independence,

to provide a stricter framework for lobbies, to give the European Parliament a budgetary power and a right of initiative, to create a binding European citizens' initiative (a European RIC [referendum on the citizens' initiative]), to establish permanent spaces for debate that allow the contributions of civil society actors, associations, trade unions and local authorities to be taken into account.

We are lucid. Some of these battles require the renegotiation of the current European treaties and rules. Because if some European rules are points of support, everyone can see today to what extent **others, and not the least, are out of step with the imperatives of the ecological and social emergency and constitute serious obstacles to the implementation of our program:**

- **Free trade treaties** oppose the achievement of our ecological objectives, fuel social dumping and promote relocation.
- **The current framework of "free and undistorted" European competition, as formalized in the European treaties and the rules derived from them,** is incompatible with the relocation of production and the preservation and development of public services and common goods.
- **The current common agricultural policy** promotes a productivist and industrial model contrary to a peasant, organic and animal welfare friendly agriculture.
- **The statute of the European Central Bank and the austerity rules of the European semester** force the States to put themselves in the hands of the financial markets and to reduce investments in the ecological bifurcation and the social State.
- **The free movement of capital** prevents us from controlling an increasingly aggressive and harmful financial sector.

As a result, **we will have to be prepared to disobey some rules.** Because of our histories, we talk about disobedience for some, about a transitional derogation for others, but we have the same objective: to be able to fully implement the shared government program and thus respect the mandate given to us by the French.

This is not a political objective in itself but a tool: many states have already resorted to it, such as Germany to prevent the opening up of the water sector to competition, a coalition of states to ban GMOs, or Spain to intervene in the face of soaring energy prices. This can only be done in respect of the rule of law. In this sense, we oppose head-on the authoritarian drift of Poland and Hungary, which attack fundamental rights and freedoms with an authoritarian and reactionary aim.

We count :

- **Use the existing margins of maneuver:** have recourse to the safeguard clauses, negotiate with the Commission the adaptations of the law and derogations necessary on a case-by-case basis in the application of our program.
- **When necessary, stop applying standards that are incompatible with the ecological and social commitments contained in our program: for example,** those parts of competition law that we

prevent the renationalization of strategic companies for the ecological transition and the creation of public poles, such as EDF or the highways, or the development of organic and local food in canteens, the budgetary rules that limit our capacity to invest in the ecological bifurcation

- **Use the contradictions between European rules and our international commitments** on climate or labor to make the most demanding standards prevail: we will put in place a principle of non-regression for society and a principle of non-harm to the environment

We will work actively to change in depth the rules that are incompatible with our program: it is a space for negotiation, for balancing power, for variable geometry cooperation. Faced with emergencies, certain rules have had to evolve: the ECB created its public debt repurchase program in response to the 2008 financial crisis; faced with the pandemic, certain rules such as the budgetary rules or the rules on state aid have been suspended by the European Commission, illustrating the need for flexibility.

The context of questioning the European rules in the face of emergencies plays in our favor. Our objective will be to drag other States with us in order to contribute as a government to reorient European policies and to modify in a sustainable way the European rules and treaties that are incompatible with our social and ecological ambition legitimized by the people. And a country like France has arguments, **tools and political weight to defend a new common horizon in Europe, among which :**

- **To lead the battles within the Council of the European Union: to** form alliances to obtain majorities on texts favouring social and ecological progress, to form blocking minorities on texts that are contrary to them, to oppose our right of veto to free trade agreements
- **Have recourse to enhanced cooperation:** move forward with a few if there is a blockage at 27. This is already being done: a coalition of 11 states is working on a tax on financial transactions. 14 States have adopted a text on international divorces to get around Sweden's veto.
- **Build cooperation with third countries that wish to do so:** this is already done for programs such as Erasmus or industrial partnerships such as Airbus and could be expanded with agreements on tax or environmental matters.
- **Trigger citizen mobilization** by building alliances and convergences with political forces that share these objectives and civil society in Europe.

These battles will be necessary but not sufficient. In order to be equal to the ecological and social emergency, the European institutions and rules must change in depth. We propose to operate a shock of democracy by convening a **European Convention for the revision and the rewriting of the European treaties**, built with the national parliaments and the European Parliament, associating the living forces and popular movements of the continent. These new texts will have to be submitted to the approval of the people by referendum.

Assume the place in the world of an independent France

- Refuse the "clash of civilizations", bring international action to the

service of peace, promote a universal and not deviated conception of human rights

- Reinvesting fully in the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE)
- Stopping the erosion of the French diplomatic network
- To offer asylum to whistleblowers, new freedom fighters in the service of the general human interest, such as Edward Snowden and Julian Assange
- To defend the sovereignty and freedom of Ukraine and the Ukrainian people as well as the integrity of its borders, in an international context of tensions and war on the European continent and in the face of the war crimes decided by Vladimir Putin

Building an independent, republican and popular defense

- Draft a white paper, adopt a new military programming law and implement our adaptation to climate change
- Stop the privatization of the arms industry and national defense missions
- Prioritize the acquisition of French military equipment in the army and from European programs in which France participates
- Mobilize digital space and spatial reality to install defensive and non-lethal systems against aggression and for peace
- Give our intelligence services the capacity to anticipate risks, including health risks, linked to climate change
- Adapting military equipment and the equipment of our soldiers to the new climate
- Launch a plan to adapt vulnerable military infrastructure
- Simplifying compensation and recognition of psychological injury in the French military
- Make arms exports subject to the principles of international law and to political partnerships democratically defined by France, create a parliamentary delegation dedicated to the control of arms exports
- Fight against mercenarism and the privatization of warfare, including the use of private military companies

Strengthening and democratizing the UN

- Reaffirm that the UN is the only legitimate body for collective security on a global scale
- Demand transparency in the deliberations of the UN Security Council and its reform for a fairer representation of the continents, in particular Africa
- Work to strengthen UN agencies that depend on voluntary contributions and increase France's financial support
- Create a World Environment Organization and defend the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) and the World Health Organization (WHO) free of pharmaceutical industry interests
- Reforming the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)

to promote food sovereignty, market regulation and the ecological bifurcation of agriculture

- To build with the States and populations concerned, under the aegis of the UN, political solutions wherever peace is not guaranteed (Near East, Middle East, Sahelian Africa, Kashmir, Caucasus, Arabian Gulf, Horn of Africa, etc.)
- Defending international law and respect for UN resolutions through France's seat on the Security Council
- To promote the creation of an ecological intervention and security force under the aegis of the UN and a non-proliferation treaty on fossil fuels aimed at banning all exploration and new exploitation of oil, gas and coal abroad
- Relaunching multilateral nuclear and conventional disarmament processes within the framework of the UN Conference on Disarmament and France's participation as an observer member in the Nuclear Weapons Ban Treaty (NWT)

Rebuilding economic cooperation

- To bring to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the World Bank and the World Trade Organization (WTO) proposals for a break with international neo-liberalism and for democratization, and to reinvest the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD)
- Integrate respect for the International Labour Organization's core labour standards into trade agreements
- Act for the adoption of a UN treaty obliging multinationals to respect social and environmental standards
- Work towards a collective settlement of public debts, independent of market mechanisms, within the framework of the resolution voted by the UN General Assembly in 2015
- Propose a global COP for social and fiscal justice under the auspices of the UN

Extending international law protections to the global commons

- Recognizing the crime of ecocide
- Support the creation of an international court for climate and environmental justice
- Create an international economic justice tribunal to try transnational financial crimes
- Expand the system of ex officio licensing and lift patents on vaccines and other medical means to fight pandemics
- Actively support the ongoing negotiations for an international treaty to combat plastics
- Make the issue of water, its protection and access for all a priority in France's international and cooperation policy
- Play an active role in the negotiations for an international treaty to protect the deep sea
- Defending the management of the Arctic and Antarctic poles as property

common to humanity, protected from economic activities that could destroy their ecosystems by the plundering of their underwater resources such as minerals or hydrocarbons

Implementing a humanist and realistic migration policy

- Strengthen the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and hold an annual conference on migration
- Oppose unequal trade agreements to prevent migrants from having to leave their countries
- Acting against the consequences of climate change through technology transfer and financial and material aid
- Putting an end to the violations of fundamental rights by Frontex
- Assuming our duty of welcome and humanity towards refugees
- Facilitate access to visas, regularize the status of workers, students, parents of school children and institute the ten-year residence permit as the reference residence permit
- Guaranteeing effective access to health care for all in the face of political instrumentalization of state medical aid (AME)
- Help create an "environmental distress" status that provides temporary protection that can become permanent depending on the severity of the disaster that led to the migration
- Put an end to the Dublin Regulation and renegotiate the Le Touquet agreements, put an end to agreements that abuse the people concerned and to the instrumentalization of development aid
- To take care of migrants thanks to a sufficient number of reception and accommodation structures throughout the country, to put an end to the offence of solidarity, to create a one-stop shop for reception
- Fully guarantee the right to asylum

Building international policies from the Overseas Territories

- Make the Overseas Territories regional poles of co-development: technology transfer to neighbouring countries, logistical and scientific assistance, establishment of high-level training courses benefiting both Overseas Territories students and those from neighbouring countries, military cooperation for peacekeeping
- Joining regional cooperations, while respecting France's strategic interests: the Community of Latin American and Caribbean States (CELAC) for the West Indies and French Guiana, the African Union for Mayotte, joining the Southern African Development Community (SADC) and actively participating in the Indian Ocean Rim States Association (IORA) for Reunion
- Definitively cancel the Montagne d'Or project in French Guiana
- Building the future of New Caledonia in dialogue with all stakeholders and through democratic consultation of the population

Building solidarity and alterglobalization cooperations

- Dedicate 0.7% of gross national income to official development assistance

- Reform the "development aid" provided by the French Development Agency (AFD) so that it does not serve the interests of oligarchic regimes and companies interested in "public-private partnerships. Decide on its allocation with civil societies on the ground, with the aim of strengthening human rights and popular sovereignty and fighting against climate change
- Acting for peace and respecting the independence of states and the sovereignty of peoples
- Relaunching co-development and cooperation, particularly in the fight against climate change
- Support sovereign debt restructuring for poor countries, cancel their debt COVID

Uniting the western Mediterranean basin around common objectives of progress

- Organize a network of Mediterranean professional education and universities
- To create a Mediterranean intervention and civil security force to fight fires and for rescue at sea in case of natural disasters
- To set up a common structure to fight against pollution and to manage the depollution of the Mediterranean Sea ecosystem
- Extend to the Mediterranean the environmental standards applicable in the Baltic Sea, particularly with regard to limiting emissions from maritime traffic

Building a relationship with Africa based on the sovereignty of the people

- Organize a debate followed by a vote in Parliament on the objectives and actions of the French army in the Sahel and in Mali
- Strengthen solidarity with the Sahel and make aid conditional on respect for human, democratic, social and ecological rights in order to better respond to the immediate needs of populations, through better coordination of international aid and taking into account local social dynamics
- To revise the defense agreements with African countries, so that they are concluded in the interest of the people and prevent any interference in the internal affairs of African countries
- To allow African countries in the CFA zone (the western part of which has become the ECO zone) to have a currency of which they have sovereignty, and whose contours they can define
- Cancel the "odious" debts of certain African countries, i.e. the debts contracted by dictatorships with the sole aim of enriching the clan in power, or to undertake actions that go against the general interest
- Create an independent commission of inquiry to establish the validity or otherwise of the accusations of blunders against the French army

Bringing to life a francophonie of peoples

- Defending the use of French in international institutions

- Create a French-speaking Erasmus
- Develop common educational content and diplomas between French-speaking countries
- Strengthening French-language audiovisual media
- Strengthening the Parliamentary Assembly of La Francophonie (APF)
- To participate in the creation of a leading French-language scientific journal at the global level
- To create a French-speaking university offering a common curriculum for access to all professions related to the aerospace sector
- Recreate spaces for Francophone cultural expression (e.g. national stages)
- Strengthen the network of French Institutes and Alliances

Relaunch the discovery of space

- Fighting the space arms race while guaranteeing France's sovereignty in the face of new threats
- Propose a new international treaty for the non-appropriation of space resources and the demilitarization of space
- To propose an international program for the depollution of the geostationary orbit and new international rules for the occupation of low orbits
- Reverse the privatization of Arianespace and protect the satellite launch industry, and strengthen the resources of the Centre national d'études spatiales
- Provide France with the means to neutralize hostile actions against it from space
- Prohibit commercial and private space travel, an ultra-polluting luxury reserved for a minority
- Guarantee the use of Galileo by the general public by making dual Galileo GPS compatibility mandatory

Items to be put to the wisdom of the Assembly

Under the institutions of the Fifth Republic, since the President negotiates and signs treaties, no government can take decisions of this nature without him. It is also understood that the national interest requires that France speak to the world with a single voice. However, the debate must take place with him. The positions are as follows.

France insoumise will propose the immediate withdrawal of France from the integrated command of NATO and then, in stages, from the organization itself. It will refuse any inclusion of our country in a permanent military alliance in the Indo-Pacific region and elsewhere, as well as any military intervention without a UN mandate. It will defend the idea of initiating the formation of a new alter-globalist entente.

The French Communist Party will support the withdrawal of France from the integrated command of NATO, and its dissolution. It will propose that France initiate a pan-European conference for a common space of peace and collective security in Europe, based on the final act of the Helsinki conference and the 1990 Paris Charter. It will defend the maintenance of nuclear power in the

European taxonomy.

France Insoumise and the French Communist Party will propose to decide, after a debate in Parliament, on a timetable for the withdrawal of French military operations in the Sahel established with the sovereign nations concerned.

Europe Ecologie-Les Verts and the Socialist Party will support the strengthening of military cooperation at the level of the European Union, the creation of a European operational military command, as well as the intensification of arms deliveries to Ukraine and the establishment of a total and immediate embargo on Russian imports of oil, coal, nuclear fuel and gas.

The Socialist Party will be in favor of keeping France in NATO.
